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Introduction


The Economic Indicators Report is an important source of timely and relevant statistical data that provides a range of valuable economic, demographic and development statistics for a variety of users.

Key Findings



Gross Regional Product

- As at June 2023, the Albury and Wodonga LGAs had a combined Gross Regional Product (GRP) valued at approximately \$9.24 billion (+11.1% from June 2022).
- As at June 2023, the Albury LGA had a GRP valued at approximately \$5.02 billion (+11.8% from June 2022).
- The 'Public Administration & Safety' and the 'Rental, Hiring & Estate Services' sectors were the top value-add contributors to Albury Wodonga's GRP in FY2023. This is consistent with the trend over the previous eight fiscal years.
- The 'Health Care & Social Assistance' and the 'Rental, Hiring & Estate Services' sectors were the top value-add contributors to Albury's GRP in FY2023. This is consistent with the trend over the previous eight fiscal years.
- Close to one-fifth of Albury's gross revenue was produced by the Manufacturing sector. It has been Albury's highest gross revenue generating sector for over two decades.



Business and Employment

- 'Health Care & Social Assistance' and 'Retail Trade' are the top two employing sectors in both the Albury LGA (32% of total employed) and the combined LGAs of Albury and Wodonga (30% of total employed).
- 'Managers' and 'Professionals' are the two most prominent occupations in both the Albury LGA (35% of total employed) and the combined LGAs of Albury and Wodonga (35% of total employed).
- As at June 2023, there were 8,386 businesses in Albury Wodonga. 58% of Albury Wodonga's businesses were sole proprietorships and 39% were small businesses (1-19 employees).
- As at June 2023, there were 5,127 businesses in Albury. 58% of Albury's businesses were sole proprietorships and 39% were small businesses (1-19 employees).
- As at June 2023, one-fifth of all businesses in Albury Wodonga were engaged in construction, one-ninth were engaged in rental, hiring, and real estate, and a further one-tenth offered professional, scientific, and technical services. The Albury LGA had an identical business profile.






Population

- As at July 2023, the combined LGAs of Albury Wodonga had a population of 101,793. Since 2018, Albury Wodonga's population has been growing at an average annual rate of 1.29%, faster than the Regional NSW average of 0.90%.
- As at July 2023, the Albury LGA had a population of 57,517. Since 2018, Albury's population has been growing at an average annual rate of 1.30%, faster than the Regional NSW average of 0.90%.
- Albury's population is expected to reach 73,477 by 2041, while Wodonga's population is expected to reach 57,087 over the same period.
- As at July 2023, 61.3% of Albury's population fell into the workforce age bracket of 15-64 years.
- Albury Wodonga is experiencing an ageing population. The proportion of people aged 65 years and above rose from 11.3% in July 2001 to 18.9% in July 2023.



Education and Income

- Albury Wodonga has a large and well-educated workforce:
 - o As at June 2021, 19.2% of Albury's population aged 15 and older possessed a Bachelor or higher degree, 24.0% possessed a Vocational qualification, and 39.1% did not possess a university or trade qualification.
 - o Compared to the 2016 Census, the number of people who possess a formal qualification has increased by 4.2%, while the percentage of people who do not possess a formal qualification decreased by 1.7%.
 - o Compared to Regional NSW, Albury had a higher proportion of people holding formal qualifications, and a similar proportion of people with no formal qualifications.
- As at July 2021, Albury's median weekly individual income was 8% greater than Regional NSW, with an average annual nominal growth rate of 3.9% since July 2016.



Key Findings



Construction Certificates

- The number of residential projects in the 2023-24 financial year was 14% lower than the prior 5-year average, while the number of commercial projects experienced a 38% decline.
- The number of construction and complying development certificates dropped by 17% to 1,001 over the 2021-22 financial year. This was followed by a 4% decrease over the 2022-23 financial year, and a further 13% decrease to 831 over the 2023-24 financial year. These declines can be attributed, in part, to rising borrowing costs and an increased cost of living.
- The value of construction for Albury in the 2023-24 financial year was estimated at approximately \$147.2 million, a decrease of 23% over the prior 5-year average.



Property Trends

- There were 939 house sales in Albury over the 2023-24 financial year. The median house price during this time was \$590,000.
- Median house prices in the Albury LGA rose by 7.5% in the 2023-24 financial year. This reflects a slower growth rate compared to the 9.8% increase in the previous financial year.
- Over the 2023-24 financial year, the number of units sold in Albury decreased by 1.6% to 247, while the median unit price rose by approximately 1.6% to \$320,000.
- Over the 2023-24 financial year, the number of vacant lot sales in Albury decreased by 11.1% to 168, while the median price increased by 39.0% to \$292,000.
